Year 7 Hockey and Netball

After a few challenging years trying to organise sporting events and games throughout a global pandemic, it has been fantastic this year to be able to get in so many amazing opportunities for the students at AGGS.

Back in September 2021, a taster session took place for Hockey and Netball Year 7 and an astounding 90 students showed for both! This commitment has been carried out throughout the whole year with numbers remaining extremely high for both lunchtime and after school clubs.

This commitment and dedication have been carried through the school with numbers remaining high for other year groups in these sports. This dedication has allowed for many sporting successes in both Hockey and Netball for all year groups at AGGS. Below we will highlight some of the great achievements and results we have had so far.

Our year 7 teams have had regular fixtures against local schools across the year and gradually these teams have bonded, improved and delivered some great results. On the 26<sup>th</sup> of February 2022, Year 7A and year 7B played Bury Grammar away winning 22-6 (A Team) and 15-5 (B team).

On the 1st of March 2022, the year 7B team attended the Trafford Secondary School Tournament and after winning all the games in their group and winning the semifinal against Wellington they went on to win in the final against Loreto 4-3. What an amazing achievement for the Year 7B team!

Our C/D teams had a game against Loreto in February and demonstrated some great netball. They worked extremely well together, and we all had a great afternoon.

It has been great to see so many of the year 7's participate in hockey this year, with over 60 students participating in after school activities at AGGS. Throughout the season year 7 have shown immense enthusiasm to learn about the sport and have worked hard to develop each performance in preparation for game days. To highlight year 7's achievement, the A team went to win the 5&6<sup>th</sup> place plate finals in the Jean Torrance Tournament in early March, with the B team narrowly missing out on the 5&6<sup>th</sup> place plate by 1 goal in the playoffs.

On the 12<sup>th</sup> of March, year 7A played Stockport Grammar at Home. Everyone went in and gave it their all, finishing the game off with a 5-1 win to AGGS. A solid performance by each student on the team. Goals from Tia and Betty, and a special mention to Louisa who scored a hat-trick in the game!

Year 8 and 9 Hockey and Netball

Our Year 8 Netball Team has continuously been improving over the year and have been attending training sessions and the funchtime club that the sports teachers have very kindly put together. Their improvement has been seen in all of their match play and tournaments. Our year 8 A team has won the Trafford Tournament and got through to the semifinals of the county tournament. They have also done extremely well in their weekly matches (played at weekend) winning all, if not almost all of their matches. Our year 8 B team have also done extremely well, winning their Trafford Tournament. All teams have improved on skill, teamwork and gameplay over the past year. We would like to thank our PE teachers for all their hard work and dedication that has been put into netball teams.



Our year 8 hockey team has had regular fixtures throughout the year, both on a Saturday morning and mid-week. We have improved our skills, gameplay and team spirit over the season. On February 3rd we played in the national schools u13 tournament and made it to the semifinals. In the middle of the season, we drew to Wellington and recently on the 16th match we beat them 4-0 which is a great improvement for our team. As a hockey team we would like to thank our PE teachers who have trained and supported us throughout the season.



For the year 9 A team, there has been an incredible amount of improvement. They have consistently won all their matches (11 out of 11) against, Bradford Grammar, Stockport Grammar, Manchester High, Lymm High, Loreto Grammar, Surbiton High, Bolton Girls, Bury Grammar, Alderley Edge Girls and Sedburgh School. They finished on a high against Kings Macclesfield School, winning 21-0 in the first quarter and winning 58-4 overall! This was their highest score all year.

For the year 9 B team, there have been 6 games this year. They had a strong start with beating Bradford Grammar 41 - 6. This was their best score all year. Also, they have recently played in the Trafford Schools tournament, coming a very close second!

We have come together from several local clubs and with many of us also playing County hockey, we have all improved throughout the season. We played in the National Schools' event at Timperley Hockey Club, coming runner up and narrowly missing the next round. We will come back fighting and stronger than ever next season!

This year has been very successful for the netball teams, with the year 10 players having participated in both regular fixtures and tournaments against local schools. These teams have bonded, improved and delivered some great results, with numerous wins across the season. 


# New Sports Hall Building!

In late October, the new sports hall and classrooms were completed. It lies on the school's existing sixth-form site at the Devisdale and includes a 1,400 sqm multi-purpose sports hall, changing rooms and the reconfiguration of existing tennis/netball courts. On the first floor, new classrooms have been built, relocating the RS Department to spacious classrooms overlooking the 6<sup>th</sup> Form Centre and devistale sports pitches. With the delivery the new building, the PE Department have been able to offer a wider sporting curriculum to the pupils, allowing them to participate in in demand clubs such as badminton and basketball.

The design of the new facilities was presented by architects at Bower Sadler Architecture whom the school has worked in collaboration with on previous projects to deliver a sympathetic yet contemporary design in the devistale conservation area.

As students, we are very happy to welcome the addition of the new sports hall – it has already made an immense difference in how we conduct sports at AGGS!
