Students are encouraged to contribute actively to the school and the wider community and take on leadership roles.



Curriculum

Moving from one stage of the national curriculum to the next is always an important step in a student's school life. The curriculum at AGGS is designed to not only challenge the students, but also to present new opportunities for learning and for developing new skills. Students will be expected to show an increased level of maturity and a growing sense of responsibility for their own work and progress. Year 7 students will study a number of subjects that they may not have been previously introduced to and will study others in greater depth.

The curriculum programme at AGGS for Years 7 to 11 is designed to facilitate academic excellence, to open students to a broad range of subjects and to enhance their skills through a variety of learning styles. Practical subjects such as drama, dance, music, and physical education sit alongside English, humanities, mathematics, modern foreign languages, the sciences and technology. Personal, social and health education, citizenship and mindfulness programmes enrich the curriculum and support personal and social development. At AGGS we place an emphasis on providing a first class, broad, balanced curriculum which fosters the pursuit of learning for its own sake, whilst ensuring that the students are gaining the skills they need to prepare them for higher education and for the work environment.




Sixth Form

The Sixth Form Centre at AGGS offers a facility where purposeful study within a challenging, exciting and supportive environment nurtures the students of today to become the independent and confident adults of tomorrow.

For existing students, the transition to the Sixth Form at AGGS provides exciting opportunities to build on the foundations laid in Years 7 to 11. Students not only benefit from a continuity of approach but also enjoy the high quality of teaching and support for which the school is recognised nationally. At the same time new opportunities for advanced level study, independent learning, personal development and student leadership make the experience fresh, challenging and exciting. Each year we also welcome students who join us from other schools. We find they settle quickly, make new friends and enrich our community.

Student Leadership

At AGGS we provide a wide range of opportunities for students to develop as citizens, both of the school and the wider community.

Student leadership opportunities are many and varied, enabling students to use and develop their leadership skills: there are head girls in the sixth form, prefects in Year 11, a peer mentoring programme, digital leaders, antibullying ambassadors, wellbeing ambassadors and a charity committee. In addition, each year group has a school council and there is an executive school council with representatives from every year group, which serve as the link between the students and the leadership of the school. These opportunities allow the students to learn that they can effect positive change and take on roles of responsibility which prepare them for life beyond school.



Extra-Curricular Activities

Beyond the classroom students enjoy an extensive range of extra-curricular and enrichment activities.

Highly committed and hard-working staff give freely of their time to ensure that students can benefit from: sport, music and drama; taking part in charity events, community work or enterprise challenges; social activities; playing and having fun together.

Curricular and extra-curricular trips and visits also add to the students' wider learning and offer exciting opportunities for personal development.

At AGGS we encourage all students to participate in extra-curricular activities as we believe these strengthen the students' interests and talents.
