## **Entry Requirements**

Students should have a minimum of four GCSEs at grade 7 or above and two at grade 6 in order to enter the Sixth Form.

A minimum of grade 6 is also required in English language and mathematics GCSE. Further information can be found in our admissions policy available on the school website.

Grades 7, 8 or 9, are required in the relevant GCSE subject to be studied at A Level.

Places are allocated in accordance with our published admissions policy; priority is firstly given to students who are existing pupils of the school. Our oversubscription criteria then allows us to allocate places firstly to applicants who are looked after, or previously looked after; applicants who reside within the catchment area who are in receipt of pupil premium; applicants who reside within the catchment area and who will have a sister at the school at the time of the applicant's proposed admission; applicants within the catchment area.

#### **Applications**



You will be required to complete information about your personal details and your subject choices. Students are also required to provide details of their predicted GCSE grades and submit a short personal statement. Applicants will be required to submit evidence of their predicted GCSE grades. These must be provided at the time of application. We are unable to contact other schools on your behalf to obtain this information.

The deadline for all applications is 3.30pm on Friday 12 January, 2024.
